PICKLEBALL STUDY GUIDE

HISTORY

- Pickleball originated at the home of Joel Pritchard in the Seattle, Washington area in 1965.
- The name came from the Pritchards' cocker spaniel, Pickles, which kept running away with the ball whenever it landed off the court.

RULES

- Serve must be hit underhand and receiving team must play the first shot off the bounce.
- No volleying is permitted within the 7-foot non-volley zone on both sides of the net.
- Both players on the serving team are allowed to serve, and a team scores points only when serving.
- A game is played to 11 points and a team must win by at least 2.

FAULTS

- Hitting the ball out of bounds.
- Not clearing the net.
- Stepping into the non-volley zone and volleying the ball.
- Volleying the ball before it has bounced once on the serve.

SERVE

- Player must keep one foot behind the line when serving.
- Serve is made underhand.
- Server must hit the ball in the air on the serve; he/she is not allowed to bounce it, and then hit it.
- Serve is made diagonally cross-court and must clear the non-volley zone.

TERMS

- Fault – infringements of the rules that end the rally.
- Volley – to hit the ball in the air without first letting it bounce.
